MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

Arts and Sciences Division:

1. Master's degree in the field of specialization from an accredited college or university, OR
2. Hold a Bachelor's degree in the field and have extensive professional experience in performing the duties of the position at the college level

Workforce Education Division:

1. Master's degree in the field of specialization from an accredited college or university, OR
2. Hold a Bachelor's degree in the field and have extensive professional experience in performing the duties of the position at the college level, OR
3. Have comprehensive training, certification, and/or work experience in the field of specialization required by the position
4. Eligible for vocational certification

Basic Skills Division

1. Bachelor's degree in the field of specialization required by the position from an accredited college or university
2. Three years of teaching experience and/or one of the following certificates or endorsements: education, ESL, TESOL, reading, math, ABE, educational psychology

A complete application consists of the following items: (Applications that do not contain all of these materials may not be considered by the screening committee.)

1. An official Yakima Valley Community College Employment Application
2. A letter of intent addressing the applicant's experience, training, and education levels as they relate to the minimum qualifications
3. A current resume
4. Unofficial college transcripts and confirmation of degree level (official transcripts required at time of hire)
5. Names and contact information for three (3) professional references

Per the provisions of the Immigration Reform and Control Act, Yakima Valley Community College hires only U. S. Citizens and Aliens authorized to work in the United States. As a condition of employment, new employees must provide acceptable proof of identity and employment eligibility.

Candidates may be subject to a Criminal History Background Check as a condition for consideration of employment.

Yakima the Community**

Yakima is located in South Central Washington, 145 miles southeast of Seattle and 190 miles northeast of Portland, Oregon. The Yakima urban area serves a population of 110,000 plus.

Yakima has four distinct seasons and averages 300 days of sunshine per year. For a small city, Yakima has all that you would expect from a larger metropolitan area with its own orchestra, theaters, museum, art scene, and large scale annual festivals.

The Yakima Valley is known for its manufacturing aircraft parts and supplies, and machinery used in food product packaging. The main industry is agriculture that flourishes through producing and processing tree fruit, hops, mint, vegetables, livestock, dairy, and wine. The extended growing season and rich soil provide the perfect condition to produce grapes excellent for wine making. The wine industry in the Yakima Valley has boomed in recent years, with international recognition of Yakima wines and vineyards.

The active participation of Yakima's citizens was recognized in 1994 when Yakima became an "All-America City."

As an important part of the community, YVCC enjoys the support of large numbers of individual citizens and corporate partners. Close to 62 corporations, organizations, and non-profits support the college through participation on the college's advisory committees.

Yakima Valley Community College is one of the oldest community colleges in the state of Washington. Founded in 1928, the college has a long tradition of quality in teaching and in its commitment to students.

Yakima Valley Community College is a public, two-year institution of higher education which is part of one of the best comprehensive community college systems in the nation. As such, the college offers programs in adult basic education, English as a Second Language, lower division arts and sciences, professional and technical education, and community services.

YVCC has been designated as a Hispanic-Serving institution by the U.S. Department of Education, a Center of Excellence for Allied Health by the State Board of Community & Technical Colleges, and is a participant in "Achieving the Dream," an initiative to help students succeed.

Grandview Campus

The Grandview campus provides comprehensive educational services that are accessible to students in the southern portion of YVCC's service district.

The Grandview campus offers a complete array of student services including advising, financial aid, admission, registration, cashiering, disability support, bookstore, and placement services. Classes are offered during the day, evening, and weekends to make learning opportunities accessible to working students.

Students

Each quarter, the student body is composed of more than 6,900 students. In a recent quarter, 54% were full-time, and 46% were part-time, 37% male and 63% female; 37% were under 21 years of ages, 31% were 21-29, 18% were 30-39, and 14% were 40 and over; 43% were students of color with 37% Hispanic and 1% international students.
