**BASIC DEGREE REQUIREMENTS**

**90 CREDITS**

90 credits in courses numbered 100 or above. "D" grades may be used to satisfy requirements but a GPA of 2.0 must be achieved within each area (except general electives). A cumulative college-level GPA of 2.0 is also required. A minimum of 30 credits must be earned at YVC. Students may graduate under the catalog in force at the time of entry for a period of not more than five years, if continuously enrolled. Application for this degree must be made by the student in the Registrar's Office.
