Direct transfer agreements (DTA) are statewide articulated transfer degree agreements between the community colleges and public baccalaureate universities. When admitted to a university, students will enter at junior standing. **Admission to a university or its College or School of Business is NOT guaranteed to students holding a Business Transfer DTA/MRP degree.** Some institutions have requirements for admission to the major that go beyond those required for admission to the university. It is highly recommended that students meet with an academic advisor on a regular basis to be sure that requirements specified in the degree are met. Students should also seek academic advising from the university to which they plan to transfer to learn about additional requirements, procedures for admission, and GPA requirements.

90 credits in courses numbered 100 or above. "D" grades may be used to satisfy requirements but a GPA of 2.0 must be achieved within each area. Note: See Business Core Recommendations, below. A cumulative college-level GPA of 2.0 is also required. A minimum of 30 credits must be earned at YVC. Students may graduate under the catalog in force at the time of entry for a period of not more than five years, if continuously enrolled. SPECIFIC UNIVERSITY REQUIREMENTS - NOTES 1 to 6				
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> To meet current EWU requirements, the second English Composition course must be equivalent to EWU's English 201-College Composition: Analysis, Research, and Documentation. Students intending the international business major should consult their potential transfer institutions regarding the level of world languages required for admission to the major. Five (5) credits in world languages may apply to the Humanities requirement. Students are encouraged to include a speech or oral communication course (not small group communication). Students intending the manufacturing management major at WWU should consult WWU regarding the selection of natural science courses required for admission to the major. International students who completed a business law degree course specific to their home country must take a business law course at a U.S. Institution in order to demonstrate proficiency in U.S. business law. Five institutions have requirements for admission to the major that go beyond those specified above. Students can meet these requirements by careful selection of the elective University Course Equivalent to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> WSU: Management Information Systems MIS 250; Gonzaga: Management Information Systems BMIS 235; PLU: Computer Applications CSCE 120, either an equivalent course or skills test; SPU: Spreadsheets BUS 1700, either an equivalent course or skills test; WWU: Introduction to Business Computer Systems MIS 220 (for transfer students entering fall 2014).
