COMMUNICATION

- Non-traditional credits not accepted in this section.
- ENGL& 101 required with a grade of “C” or better. (Exception: AP and/or IB scores)
- CMST 330 required with a grade of “C” or better.

QUANTITATIVE

- Minimum grade of “C”
- Non-traditional credits not accepted in this section.

HUMANITIES

- PHIL315 required with a grade of “C” or better
- Maximum of five credits of non-traditional credit
- Minimum 2.0 GPA required in this distribution area
- May include a maximum of five credits in skill performance courses, which are underline in the approved distribution list, and a maximum of five credits of 100 level foreign languages OR 100 level American Sign Language.

NATURAL SCIENCE/MATH

- Maximum of five credits of non-traditional credit through AP, CLEP, DANTES, or IB scores may apply.
- 5 credits must be a lab science.
- Minimum 2.00 GPA required in this distribution area.

SOCIAL SCIENCES

- SOSCI 320 & ECON 305 are required.
- Each course must be complete with a “C” or better.
- Non-traditional credits are not accepted in this section.

DISTRIBUTED ELECTIVES

- Maximum of ten non-traditional credit through AP, IB, CLEP, or DANTES may apply.
- Minimum 2.00 GPA required in this section.
- Courses must have distribution in Humanities, Natural Science, Quantitative, Social Sciences or Communication. See [YVC Catalog](#) for courses with distribution.

BASM PRE/CO REQUISITES

- A minimum grade of “C” or better is required in each course.
- Non-traditional credit not accepted
- ACCT& 203 may substitute for ACCT 235.

FOUNDATION REQUIREMENTS

- College-level credits (100 & above).
- No more than three PE activity credits may apply.
- Non-traditional credits may apply; see coordinator/advisor.
- Foundation electives are normally transferred from the AAS/AA or previous college credit.

DEGREE REQUIREMENTS 180 CREDITS

- The BASM degree requires 180 credits in courses numbered 100 or above in specific categories, including 60 credits of general education courses.
- All upper division coursework required as part of the degree program must be completed with a grade of "C" or better, in addition to an overall cumulative college-level GPA of 2.0.
- A maximum of 45 credits of non-traditional credit may be accepted in prescribed areas, see catalog for BAS non-traditional credit allowance.
- To meet YVC's BAS Residency requirements, a minimum of 45 credits must be completed at YVC. Out of the 45 credit requirement, 30 credits must be the upper division program coursework. Non-traditional credit may not be used to meet residency requirements.
- Bachelor of Applied Science (BAS) students follow the catalog in force the academic year they are accepted and enrolled into the BAS program, provided they remain continuously enrolled according to specific program enrollment standards. Returning BAS students who left prior to completion of their program must meet the program's graduation requirements as described in the YVC catalog at the time of re-acceptance and enrollment. BAS students may also choose to graduate under the official catalog in force when they apply for graduation.
- Application for this degree must be made by the student in the Registrar's Office.
